With newcomers to salt water fly fishing, we encourage fly anglers to bring some "back up" spinning equipment and prepare for the trip by developing their casting skills to include the double haul. Steve and Ryan did this and, in doing so, made a major contribution to the success of their trip. This is especially true for Belize trips where the variety of fishing opportunities can overwhelm a novice fly caster who is not prepared for the challenges of casting on the salt water flats.

Leo lent me another 8wt rod and reel which was a good thing because we rigged six fly rods differently and used them all at various times.
